



ADRA Scholarship

The ADRA Scholarship Programme offers a selected number of prospective students from low or low-middle income countries the opportunity to receive a scholarship to pursue a Master's degree in International Social Science. It provides prospective students who are already working in the field of development cooperation and/or humanitarian aid the opportunity to professionalize in the field of development studies. It especially addresses people working in Faith Based Organizations and local NGOs. ADRA offers one scholarship per year.

The scholarship will be used to reduce the tuition fee. The amount is €5000 and will be charged with the down payment. The scholarship holder is entitled to apply for any other available scholarships during the course of study.

Eligibility

To apply for these scholarships, prospective students must:

- Be employed or have been employed by an NGO working in the field of development cooperation or humanitarian aid
- Submit an application for the Master Programme of International Social Science (Development Studies) at Friedensau Adventist University
- Be motivated to work in the field of development cooperation or humanitarian aid after completing the Master programme

Application instructions:

The application for admission to the ISS Master Programme and the application for the scholarship are fully integrated; there is no separate procedure for the scholarship. Prospective students can apply for the ADRA Scholarship by indicating during the application for admission that they wish to apply for the ADRA scholarship.

In addition to the documents necessary for admittance to the Master of International Social Science (ISS), applicants have to submit a motivation letter and a recommendation letter from their current or former employer.

Selection Process

Friedensau Adventist University selects the scholarship holder. The selection committee consists of the Dean of the School of Social Science, the Head of the ISS Master Programme, and one member assigned by ADRA Germany.

Deadline for admission: March 31 for the winter semester starting in October
