We are a member of the Consortium SDA Languages Europe.




### Friedensau Adventist University,



## Why German?

- German is the most common language in the European Union
- The German economy is the strongest in Europe and 4th in the world
- German is the language of science, engineering, theology, archaeology, business, music and more
- Knowing German can benefit your career

## Who's it for?

- Adult students without German language skills. You can take a one-year course up to level B1 (fluent intermediate German in speech and writing) or you can prepare for further studies in Germany in 1.5 to 2 years
- Adult students with some knowledge of German (at least A1 level according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages). You have the possibility to prepare for further studies in German (TestDaF or "C1 Hochschule" see below) in one year.

## Certificates | Exams

- After one year, beginners can take the Goethe-Zertifikat B1 which proves that students have basic knowledge of everyday German and can deal with various situations in German.
- The TestDaF or "C1 Hochschule" exam (Test of German as a Foreign Language, required for university entrance) can be taken by students who want to study in Germany. Advanced students can reach this level after one year; beginners will need 1.5 – 2 years.

## Course content

### Structure

- One year in three terms from September to June
- Courses offered: beginners and intermediate

### Elements

- Beginning | intermediate | advanced German including grammar, vocabulary, listening comprehension, reading comprehension, writing, and speaking (20 units per week)
- Phonetics
- Cultural studies | History
- German literature
- Conversation lab in small groups
- Independent reading
- Cultural excursions

### In Addition

- Advanced students may audit classes in theology and social science
- Sports
- Choir
- Music lessons
- Ceramics, horse-back riding and other activities



## Further Information

### German and Germany

Language and culture always go together, so in addition to the language itself, one aspect of the course is to introduce students to the rich history and cultural background of Germany and Europe. Exciting trips with a perspective on art, the political landscape, architecture, and history will enrich the German experience.



Some examples from previous years:

**Hamburg**, the beautiful harbor city;  
**Munich**, the Bavarian capital near the Alps;  
**Dresden**, the fascinating baroque city of Augustus the Strong;  
**Wolfsburg**, the home of Volkswagen;  
**Wittenberg**, where Luther lived, worked, and nailed his famous 95 theses to the church doors;  
or **Magdeburg**, the near-by state capital of Saxony-Anhalt; with its 800-year-old cathedral.
